Title	Level	Prerequisite	Additional Information
Intro to Culinary Arts	9-12 (Sem.)	None	Lab and classroom format. Gain life-long culinary skills.
Senior Foods	12 (Sem.)	None	Dual Credit course. Lab and classroom format. Preparing for college and independent living. Student with prior foods course is not ideal candidate.
Pastry Arts	9-12 (Sem.)	Intro to Culinary Arts or Senior Foods	Lab format with some classroom work. Baking skills and techniques are covered.
International and Regional Foods	10-12 (Sem.)	Pastry Arts	Lab and classroom format. Travel the world through food. Repeatable credit.
Catering & Hospitality	11-12 (Sem.)	International and Regional Foods	Lab class that prepares food for others. May require outside class time commitment. Develops independence and organizational skills. Gain experience and explore careers within the food industry. Repeatable credit.

Child Development	10-12 (Sem.)	None	Classroom format. A must for future parents and those interested in working with children.
Early Childhood Teaching Lab	11-12 (Sem.)	Child Development and teacher approval	Lab and classroom format. Requires significant amount of independent work and acceptance of responsibility. Work with three and four year olds in a preschool setting. Can take for 3 semesters for credit.
Parenting	11-12 (Sem.)	None	Classroom format with some projects. Prepares you for the most important job you'll ever have...being a parent!
Individual and Family Relationships	11-12 (Sem.)	None	Classroom format with some projects. Topics include self-awareness, decision-making, communication, gender roles, marriage and the family, and family issues.
